Staging version: Access is limited to the owner and authorized administrators. No public Community service is operating. Final legal and independent security review remain required.

Terms of Use

1. Provider and scope

This staging version applies to ifocusplus.app and the Community module accessible only to the owner and authorized administrators. No public Community service is operating. Provider details: ifocusplus.app/en/legal-notice/. Contact: support@ifocusplus.app.

2. Consent and Community account

The website and app remain usable without a Community account. Only invited owners and administrators currently receive a separate, email-verified account. The accepted version, time, and acceptance of Terms and Guidelines are recorded. The Privacy Notice is information, not blanket consent. See German Civil Code §§ 305 and 307.

3. Minimum age and account security

The first public phase is intended for adults aged 18 or over. Information must be accurate. Credentials and verification codes must not be shared. Pseudonyms are allowed if they do not infringe rights or impersonate others.

4. Service scope

The Community is intended for iFocus Plus questions, help, ideas, workflows, and announcements. There is no entitlement to uninterrupted availability, publication of a contribution, a specific feature, or unchanged categories.

5. Your content and licence

You retain your rights in contributions. For as long as content is published, you grant a non-exclusive, royalty-free, worldwide licence to store, display, and process it as technically required for moderation, backup, and Community operation.

6. Prohibited content

Illegal content, threats, harassment, discrimination, doxxing, sexual exploitation, malware, spam, impersonation, manipulated voting, and infringement of copyright, trade marks, or personality rights are prohibited.

7. Moderation and action

Content may be labeled, moved, reduced in reach, or removed. Accounts may receive warnings, temporary limits, or suspension. Context, impact, and proportionality are considered. Automated signals prioritize only; materially adverse final decisions receive human review and specific reasons. See DSA Articles 14 and 17.

8. Reporting illegal content

Rule reports and formal notices of allegedly illegal content are separate. Formal notices identify the location, alleged illegality, reasons, generally a name/email, and a good-faith statement; special exceptions apply to certain offenses involving minors. Receipt, diligent review, reasons, and review routes are communicated. See DSA Article 16.

9. Review

Affected people can request review within the period stated in the decision by email. Include the decision reference and specific reasons. A different authorised person will review the case where practicable.

10. Reactions, voting, and ranking

Likes, helpful/not helpful votes, and replies are signals, not objective quality judgements. Multiple accounts, coordinated manipulation, or compensation for votes are prohibited. Ranking may use recency, relevance, activity, moderation state, and Community signals.

11. Termination and data

Community accounts can be deleted through the intended controls. Content is removed or anonymised unless legal retention, evidence, or security needs require otherwise. Suspensions for good cause are normally explained.

12. Changes

Material changes are clearly communicated before taking effect. Fresh consent is requested where required. Previous versions and effective dates remain traceable.

13. Liability

Statutory liability applies. Liability is unlimited for intent, gross negligence, and injury to life, body, or health. Further limitations receive legal review before launch. User contributions do not replace medical, legal, or financial advice.

14. Privacy, law, and language

The Privacy Policy describes protected staging. German law applies; mandatory protections of the consumer's habitual residence and mandatory venues remain unaffected. The German text controls. See GDPR Articles 13 and 32.

15. Users in the United States

The Community is operated from Germany. Mandatory local law may additionally apply. 47 U.S.C. § 230 is not an immunity guarantee. Before actively targeting a public U.S. audience, DMCA, COPPA, CalOPPA, CCPA/CPRA, and the TAKE IT DOWN Act will receive separate review.
